Back to last December when there was widespread alarm at the news that Islington Council were about to introduce a new Residents Roamer Parking Scheme from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011. This would allow residents holding valid parking permits to park anywhere in Islington. Some car owners also received notification of the increase in parking fees. Indignation was felt at the short notice and lack of consultation. Residents galvanised into action. Protests poured in to council officials and local representatives making the case that our proximity to shops, business offices and the



Whittington Hospital would once again turn our streets into car parks as happened before the CPZ was first introduced. The resulting increase in emissions from traffic was also cause for concern. At two meetings called by our Council Representative, Greg FoxSmith, residents voiced their objections in person and he was left in no doubt about the depth of feeling against the scheme. Subsequently, **Islington Council met and the decision was taken to alter the existing time (10am – 2pm) to 11am – 3pm**. The new time scale came

**into operation from 28<sup>th</sup> January. We await further assessment of the situation.**

**ENVIRONMENT:** Whitehall Park Eco-Team was officially launched on 12<sup>th</sup> January through the initiative of Jon Grayson and Ken Kitson. Householders in Harberton Road were invited to a meeting at Jon's home at 73 Harberton Road to kick-off discussions. This is an extract of what he wrote after the meeting –

*Thanks to all of you who have shown an interest in our newly formed eco-team and would like to hear more and get involved. Our numbers stand at 26 spanning a number of our local streets. To keep it manageable we will stay focused on Whitehall Park so the issues can stay local ...The plan is to have semi-regular meetings every couple of months...Below is a quick update on what our 'eco-team' hopes to do – and some ideas we have picked up from our brief chats...Our aim is to be a local community support group on green/eco matters.*

*We are participating in a wider national eco-team project, where some of us will be looking at measuring and reducing rubbish, energy and water usage. We welcome any of you to join in with this aspect as it will be part-educational too. The Council is supporting a number of eco-teams within the borough (non-financially – but we do therefore have a voice and a wider network to tap into).*

Some suggestions of topics and activities

- *Keeping abreast of what other groups, schemes etc. are up to and what they are seeking to do (e.g. low carbon zones, transition towns etc.)*
- *Sharing DIY tools*
- *Book swap (and not just eco-books)*
- *Teaming up with suppliers for bulk discounts*
- *Sharing home greening tips (e.g draught proofing, chimney balloons)*

- *Sharing energy meters*
- *Latest offers, recent schemes and relevant news*
- *Visits to eco-renovated Victorian houses*
- *Demonstrations and talks from the Council green staff*
- *Sharing advice on reliable builders etc.*
