Archway improvements: resurfacing works planned from 17 September 2016

As you may be aware, works are progressing to plan in Archway to introduce a new two-way traffic system, along with dedicated cycle lanes, improved pedestrian crossings and a new public space.

The next phase of the project involves resurfacing the main carriageway. As this cannot be completed while the road is being used, I am writing to let you know that a series of short-term closures, primarily at night, will be needed from 17 September to ensure the works are completed as quickly as possible.

Temporary road closures from 17 September 2016

A series of temporary road closures are planned to complete the resurfacing:

Saturday 17 to Monday 19 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No access northbound on Archway Road from the gyratory to Cromwell Avenue- Archway Road will be open to southbound traffic, although there will be no access between Archway Road and Langdon Park Road or Pauntley Street	From 07:00 on 17 Sept to 05:00 on 19 Sept
Monday 19 and Tuesday 20 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No access southbound on Highgate Hill between the junction with Magdala Avenue and the gyratory- Highgate Hill will be open northbound as normal	From 21:00 each night to 06:00 the next morning
Wednesday 21 and Thursday 22 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No access in either direction on St John's Way between the gyratory and the junction with Miranda Road	From 21:00 each night to 06:00 the next morning
Monday 26 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No northbound access on Highgate Hill between the gyratory and the junction with Magdala Avenue (including no access to MacDonald Road)- No access to or from Archway Close/Flowers Mews- Highgate Hill will be open southbound as normal	From 21:00 to 06:00 on 27 Sept
Tuesday 27 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No access to or from Archway Close/Flowers Mews	From 21:00 to 06:00 on 28 Sept
Thursday 29 Sept	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- No access northbound on Junction Road between Hargrave Road and the gyratory- Junction Road will be open southbound as normal	From 21:00 to 06:00 on 30 Sept

Monday 3 Oct	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No access southbound on Junction Road between gyratory and Hargrave Road - Junction Road will be open northbound as normal 	From 21:00 to 06:00 on 4 Oct
Tuesday 4 Oct	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sandridge Street will be closed. No access to Holloway Road southbound from the gyratory 	From 21:00 to 06:00 on 5 Oct

Temporary traffic diversions will be clearly signed, but please plan ahead, allow more time and use alternative routes, where possible. Live road travel information is available from tfl.gov.uk/trafficnews and [@TfLTrafficNews](https://twitter.com/TfLTrafficNews) on Twitter.

Some parking suspensions will also be needed during the works so please follow the signage that will be in place. Access for emergency services will be maintained at all times.

Please note that while every effort will be made to complete the works as planned, poor weather conditions may result in the road closures being rescheduled at short notice. Updates on the closures will be available from tfl.gov.uk/archway-gyratory during the works.

Bus passengers

Some bus stops will be temporarily suspended at certain times during the works, while bus routes 4, 17, 41, 43, 134, 143, 210, 263, 271, 390, C11, W5, N20, and N41 may be temporarily diverted. Pedestrians

Footways and pedestrian crossings will remain open, wherever possible, although some temporary closures or diversions may apply. Pedestrian access to properties will not be affected.
