# AGM Review

It seems a long time since our AGM in April when we elected Kay Clarke, Heather Eggins, Michael Heath, Malcolm Jack, Romy Jenkins, Sean Madigan, David Seton, Tony Wylam and myself to the WHPARA Committee. Although Caroline Oakes decided to step down from the Committee she will continue to liaise with the Police on our behalf on the Hillrise Safer Neighbourhood Team.

We also met the candidates for our Local Council Elections and as you know, the Labour Party is now in control of Islington. However, Greg Foxsmith retained his seat as our Council Representative.

In case you were unable to attend the AGM here's a brief summary of the past year's activities:

- We produced two Newsletters (Autumn 2009 and Spring 2010).
- Liaised with Islington Council and held a public meeting to disseminate information on the preventative and practical measures regarding the expected Swine Flu outbreak.
- Organised a Charity Concert in November in aid of the Cold Weather Night Shelter for the homeless at St. Andrew's Church.
- Held our Annual Family Fun Day in July.
- Arranged a demonstration with the Police on the Hillrise Safer Neighbourhood Team on SmartWater protection for valuable property and also simple security measures that could be adopted by householders.
- Supported the campaign against the closure of the A&E department at the Whittington Hospital.
- Finalised development of the new WHPARA website.
- Cooperated with Islington Council in producing a "Conservation Letter" for the guidance of householders undertaking building/renovation works in our area.
- Continued to have a representative on the Hillrise Safer Neighbourhood Team.
- Maintained links with local organisations e.g. Better Archway Forum (BAF), the Highgate Climate Action Network (HICAN), and Islington's Planning and Conservation Department.
