50 YEARS OF CONSERVATION IN ISLINGTON

This year is the fiftieth anniversary of the designation of the first two Conservation Areas in Islington at the New River Head and Clerkenwell.

Eight more were declared in the following year. There are now 41 Conservation Areas in Islington covering nearly 50% of the Borough.

Alec Forshaw will talk about how this came about, what the designation means for the heritage and appearance of the borough today and how Conservation Areas are managed.
